Meet Our 2022 Leaders

For the first time in 60 years, two females will lead both sides. This year, Senior Vocal Performance Major Licee Freeman and Senior Theatre Major Katy Barnes have led the side after a year like no other.

"Our first year was the 100th year, and the third year was the conjoined sides during COVID, and this year is our rebuilding year," Freeman said. "It's definitely a lot and we're trying to manage it as well as we can. Trying to make it as normal as possible because neither the

freshmen nor the sophomores have any idea what College Night is like normally."

Barnes adds, "We've been talking about it a lot, Licee and I have. We've never played College Night the same way. The centennial year, obviously that was like a huge deal. All of the stops were pulled. Everything was meticulously done. College Night 2020 was the closest thing to a regular college night, I'd assume. It was the last thing to happen before we got sent home. Last year was the combined show. Each year has been a different experience. It's been fun."

Even though Katy and Licee both attended the 2018 Show, "Code Purple," as prospective freshmen, the paths that got them here were very different.

"What drew me to the Purple Side was the diversity," Freeman said. "When I came on the prospective student night my senior year of high school, I saw the difference in the two teams. And it looked like a lot of fun on Purple Side, and I was like, 'yeah, that's the side for me."

Licee, originally from Huntsville, only knew a little bit about College Night before coming to Montevallo from the summers she spent attending the Young Musicians Camp.

"I had only a small idea of what College Night was about, and I thought I was going to be a Gold. But when I attended prospective night, I knew I was definitely

"I came to Montevallo FOR College Night," Barnes said. "As soon as I got on campus, I wanted to get involved in everything I could, help the side, whatever I could do."

"It's so crazy, because I thought about it, and I wasn't sure if I really wanted to do it, because I really love being in the show," Freeman said. "But, I also love to have my hands in everything that I can. And to be a part of everything, making sure that everything goes well."

Freeman adds, "I take around 10, 11 classes almost every semester, so I definitely know how to manage my schedule on top of being involved in so many other things. I'm really good at managing my time. It's definitely prepared me."

"I think the really cool thing about Katy and I being leaders, is that we're always on the same page," Freeman said. "We've never had a disagreement about anything. We can look at each other and know that we're on the same page. I think that's just awesome."

There's still a touch of variety to help balance each

other out.

"Licez is very organized, and really good at making sure everyone is listened to," Barnes said. "We have two different styles of humor, and two different personalities. I was talking to one of my friends, and I was like, 'Licee will get all of the 'cool people.' The cool people will be very much drawn to Licee, she will talk to them on that level, and I will get the introverted people. The way that we approach people. We can meet people at several different levels. We have different life experience, and we know how to make different types of rooms feel like safe places."

As the world around us continues to change, and we try to navigate what the 'new normal' might look like, there will be one tradition returning to Palmer Hall—a live audience of current students, alumni, family, and friends.

2021 was a year like no other. It was the 100th year of celebrating the creation of the Gold and Purple Sides, with an unprecedented combined show.


"I want people to remember how much fun they had,"

"I want people to acknowledge and recognize what College Night is," Freeman said. "What it can do, and what it has done, for people. I think that's my main thing. There's still so many people who don't understand it and don't know what it's really like. I would just love to see them understand what it is, finally, and to enjoy it. It's my favorite thing. It's one of the things that's kept me here and I hope they get the same experience that I had."

Barnes adds, "My freshman year, someone told me that they would rather lose as a Purple than win as a Gold, and I thought about that all four years, playing the game," Barnes said. "I'd rather win as a Purple. I'd rather play as a Purple. And I can look back and say, 'I had the best time."
